List characteristics of sexual health, function, and dysfunction; Evaluate patients with female sexual dysfunction based on a biopsychosocial framework; Select appropriate therapy for female sexual interest or arousal disorder; Distinguish clinical signs of rheumatoid arthritis from those of osteoarthritis; Counsel patients about head-to-toe pain, inflammatory back pain, and shoulder and neck pain.
