Chronic Liver Disease - Jeanette Hasse, PhD and Douglas T. Dieterich, MD

Diagnose conditions caused by abnormalities in nutrition-related functions of the liver; Treat patients with complications associated with chronic liver disease; Recognize the impact of malnutrition and frailty on long-term survival in patients with chronic liver disease; Individualize dietary recommendations in patients with decompensated liver disease; Elaborate on strategies underlying emerging therapies for hepatitis B virus infection.

Implement current guidelines for colorectal cancer screening; Identify patients for whom colorectal cancer screening is appropriate; Incorporate strategies for colorectal cancer screening to increase sensitivity and specificity; Elaborate on factors contributing to the failure of high-level disinfection for endoscopic equipment; Follow current recommendations for reprocessing to decrease risk for endoscope-related infection.

Choose medications to target specific symptoms associated with IBS; Counsel patients about treatment options for IBS with constipation- or diarrhea-predominant symptomatology; Differentiate IBS from chronic constipation using Rome IV criteria; Encourage diet and lifestyle modifications to manage symptoms associated with IBS and chronic constipation; Provide office-based treatment for common anorectal conditions.

Explain the pathophysiology of portal hypertension and ascites; Identify and refer appropriate patients for the TIPS procedure; Evaluate and treat patients with chronic HBV infection; Optimize management of primary biliary cholangitis; Diagnose autoimmune hepatitis and individualize treatment.
